FORUM MINUTES 6 October 2010

Two meetings were held on 6 October. In line with ideas to extend the Forum to more people at different times, all Meon Road Junior parents of Years 5 & 6 were invited to a 3.20 pm meeting. The usual Open Forum was also held at 7pm.

MEON ROAD JUNIOR FORUM 3.20

Five parents and 8 children came to hear from Steve Oldreive and Sophie Davis from the council Leisure service how play facilities are provided in the area. New money from the Government had improved 28 play areas in the City for 8-13 year olds and was used in Milton at Milton Park, Milton Common and St James Field.

Dawn Fisher explained her role as a play champion. She is a volunteer encouraging young people to play in the parks. This can assist parents who have more than one child. Dawn will help at the playscheme on Saturdays at St James Field financed through the Forum by a Grassrootsgrants

Parents felt that a Sunday playscheme would be better than Saturdays when there is a lot for children to do in town and the Forum will try for more grants

A parent asked if skate parks are open to all young people. The answer was yes. They are for beginners and immediate levels.

Steve Oldreive advised to report any accidents etc that happen at play parks to the council as he would like to know about them. Parents raised the issue of dog fouling on Milton Common. Steve encouraged them to keep reporting it and the Chair agreed to ask the Dog Warden to patrol in the early mornings. Play park areas are fenced off to prevent fouling near play equipment. Parents asked if they could meet Community Wardens at the next Forum as they usually only see them in a van around Milton.

OPEN FORUM MEETING 7PM

Milton Village Hall and Community Café Chris Richards explained Milton Village Hall main hall will be extended and a new second hall built with a new kitchen which will enable a new café to be built at the front on the garden. An ash tree and a fir will be removed but 2 trees planted in the park. This is a joint venture between PCC and Langstone Church. Steve Macfarlane gave a presentation on the 36-seater, day-time community café which will be run by the Church as a 'no profit' organisation serving high calibre coffee, teas, soft drinks and light food. Milton Village Hall will be able to use the area in the evenings. Residents and local businesses had been consulted.

Is the hall was currently underused? It is used regularly but the extension will allow bookings for larger groups. Although no specific parking will be offered, cycle racks will be provided. Likely rental over the period of the lease would be around £18,000. Concerns arose on whether the offer of partnership between this business and the community centre should have been put out to tender to gain the best deal for PCC and future maintenance of the Hall. There was no –one at the meeting able to comment on this.

FORUM MINUTES 6 Oct cont

CHANGES TO 13/14 FIRST BUS ROUTE

Danny Johnson of PCC explained the background of the bus services and advised that the Council do not run the buses. PCC do pay for 50% of the non commercial services in the city, which the bus companies will not run as the routes are not profitable. However, 85% of all routes are commercial routes and the shareholders of the bus companies set profits and would withdraw monies if profits were not met. PCC has no statutory powers over the bus companies.

Dervla McHugh, from First Hants & Dorset Bus Co advised that they have been struggling to make a profit with the 13/14 route, with sometimes only 1 or 3 passengers using the service in the evening. Dervla also advised that there have been no complaints via customer services to the proposals.

A resident asked when the last bus will be. Cllr. Vernon Jackson was able to report that the Council had found enough funds to pay for 1 further run along the route at night, so the last bus for the number 13 will be 20:10 and 19:20 for the number 14.

It was raised that if the buses were more reliable then maybe more people would use them. Dervia advised that residents should report late buses or buses that do not turn up. Residents advised that they can never get though on the customer helpline number. Dervia acknowledged that it can be difficult to get through but that complaints or comments can be done through their website.

Residents were encouraged to use these means of communication in future to report all their problems with buses.

An observation was made that it was not surprising that the 13/14 bus route had low passenger numbers when the Portsmouth University had its own free bus service along the same route. If this is a factor in losing evening services in Milton, then the University buses should be made accessible to residents.

BRENT GEESE AND PLANNING

The Chair apologised that Hampshire Wildlife Trust would not be attending this meeting as advertised. The Trust is preparing a new Brent Goose Strategy which will be ready after Christmas and they will be invited to the next Forum.

CO-OPTED MEMBER

Larry Nicholas, former Link Officer to the Forum was welcomed at the meeting and co-opted onto the Committee.

PORTSMOUTH YOUTH PARLIAMENT



Through Ben Dowling, a member of the Milton Neighbourhood Forum Committee, we have had great support from members of the Youth Parliament helping our Committee Deliver the last issue of Milton Matters. We would like to thank them most sincerely for helping us out when the Council stopped providing a delivery service. Such support from all our volunteers is very much appreciated.

The news on future issues, is that we have reached an agreement with the Leader of the Council and officers. If we include the programme of the Milton Village Hall Community Association and increase distribution by 1500 PCC will continue to pay 25% the <u>printing</u> cost of Milton Matters, but NO <u>delivery_costs</u>. Our advertisers provide the remaining 75% for which we are most grateful.

At the last Forum, we asked for volunteers to help with delivery. We are keeping your names and phone numbers in reserve. The Youth Parliament and our Committee members have completed the delivery of this issue, and we will review future policy in the light of the plans by the Council to re-organise the Forums which could involve a change in boundaries along Ward lines. This would exclude Moorings Way area from Milton. If you believe the Forum area represents the neighbourhood you identify with, please e-mail your councillor (see P.20)

GREAT GREEN BUSH CRICKET



We asked in thee last edition and asked if you knew what this was. The Great Green Bush Cricket is the largest insect in England and can only be found in the south around July to October. It prefers to live on rough grassland and on uncut fields in long tall grass but it needs bare patches of grass nearby to lay its eggs.

The GGB Cricket is about 5 cm in length, is a grass-green colour and has a cone-shaped head with a brown stripe on the top with two long antennae. You can often hear the cricket before it is seen when the males rub their hind legs together very quickly to create a 'song' which attracts females. The crickets do not live through the winter, depending upon their eggs for next year's population.

The Council has recognized the importance of this and other rare creatures by including part of Milton Locks, 4 hectares of Lakeside, Great Salterns Nature Reserve, part of the Golf Course, part of Horsea Island, part of Eastney Beach, as Local Wildlife Sites to enable planning officers to prevent building on the city's wildlife spots. So next summer, don't be surprised if you find one of these very special giant crickets on the open areas around the east of the city. If you see one, it is a very memorable sight.



RESOLVED ISSUES?

Thanks are due Colas for planting three new trees in the Rodney Road shrub beds to prevent this area being used for parking. We have been chasing Colas to improve this area and they have also spruced up the flower bed. A big improvement all round!

The damaged Hornbeam tree in the garden of Shearwater House is due to be replaced in the next 6 weeks with a flowering cherry.

Did you come to the Forum meetings last year where we raised the issue of the appalling service the City received during the bad weather of January 2010? Raising this issue in two Forum Meetings with the public present to hear the Council Officers' explanations, may well have had some impact. This December's response by the Council, was much improved. A leaflet was published with a map showing the primary roads which COLAS will treat as Priortiy1 roads, and the secondary roads which are Priority 2. It also shows 69 public salt/grit bins.

If you did not see the leaflet in Libraries etc., you can go to www.portsmouth.gov.uk and select 'getting around' within the 'living' menu, then click on 'snow and ice on the roads'. Winter is not over yet and this information may be a lifesaver.

In our area, Eastern Road, Langstone Road, Milton Road, Eastney Road, Velder Ave., Rodney Road, Goldsmith Ave and Fratton Way are Priority 1. Furze Lane, Moorings Way, Locksway Road, Priory Cres., Bransbury Road and Devonshire Ave are Priority 2.

At the next Forum we will hear from Thelma Turner Hill who has worked for many years in the Carers' Centre and will answer questions on services.

We will also hear more about the Brent Goose Strategy from Hampshire Wildlife Trust and hope to have a view from the Planning Department on applying their recommendations to future planning applications.

With the usual updates from the Police and other local issues, please come along as the Neighbourhood Forums are under scrutiny to provide value for money to the Council. If they are not supported, we can see them being closed which would result in the loss locally of this magazine, our Picnic on the Green and the chance to voice opinions when matters of concern arise.
