## FORUM PUBLIC MEETING MINUTES 28 February 2007

#### RESIDENTS' PARKING IN MILTON

Michael Robinson, Deputy Parking Manager for Portsmouth City Council, confirmed that residents' parking schemes across Milton would be finalised and implemented shortly, probably during June 2007. He stated that this cope of the scheme(s) would be based upon information submitted by residents, who have been asked whether or not they wish for a scheme in their area.

Michael explained that information received from residents indicates that those in the western side of Milton were in favour of a residents' parking scheme, whereas those in the eastern side were not.

Questions from the floor included whether every household in the area has been contacted to submit comments, and whether the final scheme will be based upon imperfect information if only a percentage of residents respond. He stated that if 30% of residents respond, and if the majority of that 30% are in favour of a scheme, then the City Council will implement one. A show of hands indicated that some residents present wanted a scheme, and others did not. Michael stated any scheme implemented would be monitored and, if necessary could be modified.

Simon Moon spoke about traffic calming initiatives in the area. As the humps have reduced the speed of traffic and have done what they set out to do, they will remain. He confirmed that speed humps are of a standard height. As some of them are wearing and showing metal through the covering, they will be repaired by Colas.

Residents asked why Catisfield Road was excluded from the one-way scheme, as it is felt that it now takes more than its fair share of traffic. Councillor Alex Bentley confirmed that a survey could be undertaken in the next six months and the statistics on local traffic

flows communicated to residents. Simon confirmed that the 20mph speed limit will stay in the area and that pollution levels were measured before restrictions were put in place and these could also be compared with current levels if necessary.

In response to a specific question, Simon agreed to investigate the poor signing at Shelford Road, where the "no entry" sign is not readily visible until vehicles have entered the road which could result in accidents.

#### YOUTH ACTION UPDATE

Julian Wadsworth, Project Leader working at Milton Village Hall, gave an update on what is happening in the area for young people, focusing on a project operating in Milton and Eastney, based at Bransbury Park. The scheme is backed by the Football Foundation and organized through Portsmouth Football Club, together with a range of local professional youth workers. (see latest news on Page 8)

The scheme is a social inclusion project, encompassing 2,500 young people from the area and with participation being linked to school attendance and behaviour. It covers youngsters aged between 10 and 19 years of age; is free but they must live in the area bounded by Henderson Road, Highland Road, St. Augustine Rd., Goldsmith Ave., Rodney Rd, Velder Ave., Moorings Way, shoreline, to Ferry Rd. as shown on the map provided to the meeting.

#### FIRE & RESCUE SERVICE - FREE HOME FIRE SAFETY CHECKS

Tim Gates, from Southsea Fire Station, spoke about a free home fire safety scheme operated by the Hampshire Fire and Rescue Service. Fire Officers will visit residents in their own homes (by invitation) to advise on safety issues, formulate escape plans in the event of a fire and supply free smoke detectors. Advice can also be provided on methods to prevent or reduce the risk of arson opportunities.

#### Southern Water Proposals for Preventing Sewer Flooding

The company have prepared a scheme to enlarge the capacity of the pumping station at Eastney. They will be applying for planning permission to build a new £10m pumping station to manage storm water flows and to support the present station during storms.

Portsmouth's Victorian sewers carry rainwater as well as sewers. As storms are becoming more frequent this has put a strain on the existing system. Two-thirds of Portsmouth lies below high-tide level so the rainwater and wastewater have to be pumped away rather than flowing away by gravity. The new pumping station will be built alongside the existing station but under Bransbury Park. It will be grassed-over.with only the 9 manhole covers surrounded by grasscrete blocks.

There will also be new buildings at the Pumping Station to house, electric booster pumps, a generator and screening equipment to remove debris. These will be housed at the north and north-east part of the existing site where the sewers lie now.

During construction, the site office and materials compound will go on the Fort Cumberland Road car ark to ensure Bransbury Park and sports p itches are not affected. A working area including Henderson road car park and some grassland at Bransbury will be needed during construction. The footpath to Wake Lawn will be diverted during this period. Construction work is planned for Monday – Friday 7am to 7pm and Saturdays 8am to 1pm but pumping away ground water may have to run 24 hours..

We have invited Southern Water to the next Forum on 27 June to outline their scheme and listen to residents' comments.

Julian Wadsworth, Project Manager says "We are really aware that the whole area needs a truly holistic approach to working with young people and residents in our wards. We are working hard to support local schools with young people who are disengaged in some way from mainstream education and have had some level of success already at Miltoncross School in the past 4 months".

Positive Futures staff are now seeing the hard work they put in last



year, paying dividends with development of new sports facilities at Bransbury Park where they have enlarged our Skateboard area. Uture expansion of Eastney Community Centre will also help them deliver a wide

range of new structured activities.

The scheme has funding for 3 years but with the support of its partners - the Police, University, Royal Navy, Portsmouth Council and Connexions, hopes to extend this and introduce new face-to-face workers into the area to improve participation opportunities.

#### POLICE NEWS

#### Operation COBRA Locksway Road

We have been alerted by the local Police of vulnerable cars in Locksway Road area. Project COBRA is aimed at reducing car crime so

- Always lock your car and put your windows up even if just getting petrol or posting a letter
- If you are stationary in traffic, keep doors locked and windows not too far down to stop 'bag grab'
- Don't even leave low value items in the car as thieves will smash and grab looking later to see if things are valuable
- Don't hide items under the seat or in glove box as someone may have watched you - use the boot before leaving home
- Nearly half of incidents where items are stolen from cars happen when they are parked overnight close to home
- Chose a stereo that can be removed and make sure you take it

Come along to the next Neighbourhood Forum on 27 June at Meon Road School to hear how the Neighbourhood Policing Pilot Project in Portsmouth has worked. It was introduced in April last year and has now been refined and extended to the whole of the Hampshire Force.

A key feature of Neighbourhood Policing is community liaison and this is why there Local Surgeries run by the Police Community Support Officers. Here in Milton they are run at the local Co-op in Eastney Road at various times of the day to enable all sections of the community, pensioners, school children, workers to contact the PCSOs inside the store to discuss any areas of concern or to get information. Look out for their SANDWICH BOARD outside the Co-op when they are on duty. Their Community Bus is always available in Palmerston Road on Thursday afternoons and at other times around the city. Lots of leaflets and bike marking kits are available, so use these services!
