FORUM MINUTES 17 June 2009 PORTSMOUTH FOOTBALL CLUB

Unfortunately, PFC made a last-minute decision not to attend the Forum but Eleanor Evans from Planning Aid South (an independent service providing help and support to communities on town and country planning matters) gave a useful presentation about Planning Aid which offers local communities support from its volunteers who can assist in running a consultation event and advise on local planning matters free of charge.

Debate was restricted because PFC were not present to discuss their plans for Fratton Park .The works already agreed by the Planning Authority to rotate the pitch etc have not been carried out. Representatives of the Portsmouth Football Supporters at the meeting said the Council should support PFC. Councillor Vernon-Jackson confirmed that to help Portsmouth achieve its ambitions, the Council have already agreed to sell them land at Horsea Island if the Club decides to move there and by making application to host the World Cup here they would further help PFC.

Eleanor agreed that she will be prepared to become further involved as and when PFC announces its plans, and could assist in other issues, such as the (now deferred) City Centre redevelopment.

HEALTHY TOWN STATUS

Jonathon Smith from Portsmouth City Council spoke about work being undertaken to make people aware of the need to keep healthy, and confirmed that PCC has received £3.1 million to assist with this. Various things being encouraged include the need for people to consider growing their own produce using allotments etc. encouraging children and young people to eat healthily, promoting schools to have cookery training classes, and helping people achieve a healthier life-style by cycling and walking initiatives. He also confirmed that there are 10 community centres delivering food into the community at present and this number should increase.

Mention of cycling initiatives promoted debate on the dangers of cycling on pavements and on the promenade. Councillor Vernon-Jackson stated categorically that he stands by the decision **not** to permit cycling on the promenade.

TRAFFIC UPDATE

Michael Robinson, PCC Deputy
Parking Manager, gave an update on
issues raised at the previous Forum.
He confirmed that yellow lines will be
introduced in Moorings Way adjacent
to the Milton Retirement Village by the
end of July and that the 'no right turn'
from Rodney Road into Milton Road
(turning south) will also be introduced
at the same time (these will be
published).

FORUM MINUTES 17 June... TRAFFIC UPDATE (CONT)

Issues raised and discussed were:-

- why are there traffic humps as well as 20 mph speed restrictions? (implemented at different times);
- why is Catisfield Road the only one not made a one-way thoroughfare?;
- the need for positive signing of 20 mph restrictions at Moorings Way school (Michael will follow up this issue);
- 20 mph restrictions still require positive policing.

Car parking space provision in new developments – Councillor Darron Phillips confirmed that the Council now requires adequate provision for parking when considering planning applications

POLICING IN MILTON

Acting Inspector Stu Boyd and PS
Heather Terrett confirmed that
operation Nemesis (anti burglary) had
been very successful. During the July
to September 2009, there will be a
push on anti-social behaviour in the
area and Heather mentioned the
greater interest now in Neighbourhood
Watch schemes. She suggested that
there should be a pilot scheme in the
area to establish the merits of
promoting schemes.

Pedal cycle thefts are increasing and the police are continuing to hold surgeries in the Co-op store in Milton Market every fortnight as well as the monthly surgery with Councillors in Bransbury Park.

Inspector Boyd and PS Terrett were thanked for their continuing support

ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

Mountbatten Centre:

is the new pool large enough to qualify for Olympic standards? (Councillor Vernon-Jackson confirmed that it is and stated that it is very popular with children and the over 60s)

Victoria Swimming Baths:

disappointment expressed that the baths have closed and that this resource, along with others, is lost because of promotion of the Mounbatten Centre

Mary Rose School:

One resident stated that he was impressed with the "wow factor" of the school, as well as for the Mountbatten Centre.

Shopping Areas

there was mention of the social change and the demise of local shopping centres because of grandiose schemes such as the City Centre redevelopment or shopping facilities linked to PFC's possible plans. Milton is lucky to still have a good local shopping area, which should be promoted and preserved

Hampshire Fire Authority:

Officers from Southse Fire Station were present for part of the meeting to see what goes on in the Public Meetings. They may wish to give a presentation at a future Public Meeting.

The Chair thanked the speakers and residents for attending the forum which closed at 9.0 pm

you can achieve with relatively small plots of land.



She is determined to try again next year. Why not give it a go yourself? Even if you only have a patio, so long as you can give the vegetables a good depth of compost or a growbag, and are prepared to water them regularly, you should get some good results.

But maybe you don't know where to start? This is quite understandable since growing veg has been in decline since the last War when parks were dug up to grow food for the nation and young women were drafted in to become Land Girls. If a 'Learn to Grow Vegetables at Home' scheme could be launched locally, would you like to join in?

UNPAID WORK IN THE COMMUNITY


Following a request in August to the Probation Service their Community Payback team quickly got to work on Essed Road and have made a great job of tidying it and trimming the shrubs.
