

Crime/car break-ins/damage, etc should be reported to Southsea Police Station at all times as soon as possible.



JOIN THE FRIENDS

The Friends of Langstone Harbour were formed in 1997 and have grown rapidly in numbers and influence over the last 5 years. Our aims are to help conserve, protect and improve Langstone Harbour and to increase local awareness about this ecologically important area. One of our most popular activities is a regular 'workout' on the last Saturday of every month when practical tasks are carried out, usually in partnership with one of the organisations who manage the shoreline. For example, one month we may be helping to prepare nest sites for Little Terns at the oysterbeds, another, clearing debris from the shore at Eastney.

Our team of 'Shorewatchers' keep an eye on a stretch of Harbour shoreline. Any exciting finds or potential problems can quickly be reported on to those who need to know. We have a seat on the Advisory Committee for Langstone Harbour Board so we can help influence the management of the harbour and we try to comment on planning applications brought to our notice that may impinge on the Harbour and its immediate surroundings.

We have two open meetings each year in April and October when we invite a speaker and have a chance to meet together socially at the Tudor Sailing Club off the Eastern Road at 7.30 We also publish two newsletters a year to keep people in touch with what's happening around the Harbour. Summary of Milton Neighbourhood Forum, 28 February at Dymond Lecture Theatre, Milton University Campus

The Chair welcomed members and guest speakers before reporting on events since the last Forum.

- 1 Extra waste bins and dog bins by local shops
- 2 City Plan Rejection by the Development Control Committee to the renewal of planning permission for development of Langstone Campus for further student flats.
- Foster Hall University Building The Committee has submitted views to the Planning Department on future uses for the building when the University sells it. These included housing for the elderly or a hotel in the main building, a health centre or gym in the small building in the grounds. The Committee are pursuing listed Building Status for the Dymond Building and walled garden. The Department has promised to keep the committee informed.
- Stopping up the footpath for housing in Hester Road
- 5.. Committee Resignations Two vacancies on the committee are available for Forum Representatives. The Chair invited anyone willing to serve the Forum, to telephone 92 736153. The duties are attending meetings one evening a month for 2 hours. Your local knowledge and interest will be well rewarded by helping your area!
- 6. Milton Town Green in St James Hospital has been extended by the draft City Plan. Not yet adopted, this plan suggests the green should be 8 instead of 5 acres.

Where the Money Goes by PCC Director of Finance

Mr Roger Ching explained that the budget was set the previous week at £385 million, covering the cost of services for the City. Expenditure takes two forms, capital and revenue. The net budget of £185 m. is set by the government taking account of population, and the City's needs. Mr Ching was currently reducing this year's budgeted figure of £191m to meet the Government level.

Council Tax of £47.4 m has to be collected from almost 80,000 homes in the City. Council Housing costs £78 m, Education £110m. The suggested increase in Council Tax this year had been suggested at 11% but was held down to 9.8%. The reasons for the increase include:-

- Refuse collection contract increase by 3-4%
- Costs of homelessness 1%
- Housing benefit 2%
- Fire Service levy 1%

Questions from the floor included apportionment of the money, the cost of the Millenium Tower, Monorail and the celebrations for the Queen's visit this year.

Matters Arising:

Police representatives reported they were very aware of the problems at Avocet House and the many complaints. Hopefully CCTV will be installed nearby. There is evidence of vandalism around the City and the Police are trying to encourage young people off the streets by offering sports education.

University is offering football on the Langstone site on Thursday evenings from 4-6 pm. So far 30 girls and boys aged 8-14 have come along. Portsmouth Football Club also hope to offer facilities when land is available. It was agreed more resources are needed.

New ward boundaries. Following the changes to Milton Ward, the areas which have moved into Baffins Ward will be in Portsmouth North for Parliamentary Elections.

HM Queen Golden Jubilee. It was suggested a celebration be held on Milton Town Green on Monday 3 June and those present supported this.

At 9.05 the Chair thanked speakers and members for attending.
