SKATEBOARD FACILITIES IN MILTON

Young people in Havant, Denmead, Clanfield, and other neighbouring towns have free access to skateboarding facilities. It was recognised last year by the local beat Police that although Portsmouth youngsters have the Southsea Skatepark, they needed extra facilities which they could enjoy free of charge. At the Forum we heard of their ambitious scheme for a 'skate bowl' at Furze Lane. Sadly this did not progress further than the planning stage as the University withdrew the offer of use of their land.

The Forum took up the challenge and made a bid for funding under the Neighbourhood Renewal Unit Community Chest and the New Opportunities Fund which is Lottery Funded. We have just heard that the bid was successful and we have been granted £3000 and £27000 respectively from these two funds. The proposal which met their support is to provide skateboarding facilities in both Milton Park and Bransbury Park.

The money has to be spent by October 2004 and it can only be spent on this play equipment. Only four other schemes in Portsmouth gained New Opportunities funding

Arundel Court School Community Environment Project to provide an oasis of calm, greenery, etc

 St. Mary's Viewpoint, ball park with lighting and youth shelter

 Wymering Methodist Church Security improvements to promote use of the community centre

 Milton Piece Community Allotments with disabled access and support by part-time staff

The City Council is supporting the introduction of neighbourhood skate parks and has prepared a consultation document proposing that these be sited in Bransbury Park, Milton Park, Stamshaw Park with a BMX facility in Wymering Youth Centre. The next stage is to bring the proposals for our local area to the Milton Forum for public consultation and this will take place at the next forum. Do come along and give your views. Last time this was discussed their was a lively discussion but at the end of the meeting, a vote was taken and the result was in favour of making skate board provision available in our area.

Let's have some young people along at the next meeting. By getting this money we have shown that we are interested in providing things for you to do in Milton and clearly want you to use the new facilities responsibly when they are built.

Minutes of Open Forum held 22 October 2003

The Link Officer kindly ran this meeting which had been urgently called to publicise the plans for the Milton Campus Site which would be considered at Development Control Committee on 29 October. He updated the meeting on recent committee activity - Community Police promoting Neighbourhood Watch Schemes, discos for 11-16 year olds and on parking changes in Velder Avenue and new 30 mph speed restrictions on Eastern Road to Sword Sands Path. In the new Central Depot site the speed limit will be 20mph. He reported monitoring of tree damage in St. James by Cllr. Scott.

Milton Campus Site

Mike Allgrove from the Planning Dept. explained the Outline and Detailed planning schemes submitted to the Council by Barratts which offered 154 flats on the front of the site facing Milton Road. They proposed demolishing all existing buildings on site, 154 flats and 154 parking spaces, 32 affordable homes, retain some of the trees on site, restore and enhance the walled garden with public access in daylight hours.

He explained that the Committee would be considering the proposal in the light of the Council's decision to build a new Special School on the rear of the site, the City Plan and the Council's Planning Brief for Milton Campus.

Questions and comments from the floor covered:-

- Concern about access to site from Locksway Road when the Milton Road access is closed (Mr Allgrove stated there would be £20,000 towards traffic calming in Milton)
- Density of dwellings at 127 per hectare
- Taking a decision before the Inspector's report on the New City Plan is published in the New Year
- Loss of mature trees

October Forum Minutes - Continued

- Coach access for school transport (Mr Allgrove will raise this with City Engineer)
- Car Parking allocation which will cause problems with onstreet parking for site visitors
- Level of new development and its contribution to congestion
- Style of building and height
- Retention of Canal Footpath
- Placements into affordable housing
- Objections to losing existing building shell
- Piling on site affecting Locksway Road homes

Residents were urged to put their views in writing to the Planning Department before the Committee.

Forum Constitution

Election of Officers

The existing Officers and Committee were re-elected.

OUTCOME OF PLANNING APPLICATION

The plans for 154 flats were referred back to Barratts by the Committee on 29 October for revisions. A number of objectors attended the meeting and raised the above issues. However, at the November meeting the plans were passed after the flats had been moved back slightly, 2 fewer trees would be lost and Ward Councillors supported the changes. The new building will be 25 metres away from the fence, whereas Foster Hall is 50 metres away now .(see p7)

TRAFFIC CALMING IN MILTON

The Council has now completed the consultation exercise and plans have been finalised for the traffic calming in the roads between Locksway Road and Warren Avenue. This will involve some **road humps**, although fewer than were originally planned.

There will be one-way roads in Mayles Road, Shelford Road, Crofton Road, Hollam Road, Catisfield Road. Drivers will not be able to travel in the same direction along the whole of these roads, but will need to turn left or right into Meon Road to access either Locksway Road or Warren Avenue.

There will be a speed limit of 20 mph in these roads plus Church View, part of Warren Ave, Blendworth Road, Meon Road, Posbrooke Road, Weston Ave., Milton Park Ave., Mariners Walk and Euston Road.

The work is due to begin in March 2004 at a cost of £130,000.

There are also plans out to consultation at present to establish **20mph** outside Moorings Way School, to **narrow** the road there, install an advisory **cycle lane** and install a **pedestrian refuge** in the road. The City Engineer is accepting comments on this scheme now which will cost £30,000.

All the above are planned to reduce the high number of accidents recorded in the area.

In view of the speeds being experienced in Locksway Road, the Forum has written again to the Council to ask for controls in this road also.

The Committee is currently looking into skateboard ramps, etc. for Bransbury and Milton Parks and we shall be discussing this at open forum in response to concerns we have heard in the past that there is not enough organised for young people. Is there anything else we could be doing?

There are grants and awards made by various bodies. You will remember how successful the Avenues Association was in gaining money for Milton Common


